Any skills or qualifications needed for entry into class?

None. An enthusiasm to learn.

Course Description

This course is aimed at beginners, and those who have painted before, but would like to learn watercolour painting techniques from scratch, supported by accurate drawing skills. The aim of this course is to equip learners with the basic techniques necessary to produce basic, but competent paintings in watercolour, and to address particular problem areas the individual learner might have.

Teaching/learning methods used

Discussion and demonstration.

Homework

None is required, but it is often beneficial to complete paintings at home, as it is not always possible to allow time in class once learning activities have been developed to spend as much time as the learner needs to paint at his/her leisure.

Progression

Learners will be able to apply their newfound skills when creating their watercolour painting.

Materials and equipment

Watercolour paints in tubes, (essential) cadmium red, cadmium yellow, paynes grey ultramarine blue, (preferred extra) naples/turners yellow, burnt sienna, burnt umber, alizarin crimson, cobalt blue, Prussian blue (alternatively a basic watercolour set will be fine). Watercolour pad, 200gsm/140lb minimum size A4. (Goldline watercolour studio pad is the most economic at £8-£12 for 100 sheets and will be suitable for beginners exercises). Plastic mixing tray with 18 paint well and 5 mixing trays (essential). Large watercolour brush (pointed) size 14 and size 8. Large mixing pot. Pencil and rubber. Kitchen roll. Masking tape. Small sticker labels to label your paints one in the mixing tray and selotape to seal them.
