## Any skills or qualifications needed for entry into class?

None required, just an interest in flower arranging.

## Course Description

This course will enable you to produce a selection of fresh flower designs and learn construction techniques and how to use a selection of tools and equipment. You will learn basic floristry techniques which can then be applied to making commercial arrangements for a mixture of occasions.

## Teaching/learning methods used

Discussion and demonstration.

## Materials and equipment

Each week students need to bring their own flowers, foliage, scissors, tape, wire, a suitable oasis and container, and a notepad and pen.

## Learner Outcome

Participants will develop their floristry skills including using a wide range of accessories for use in a range of formal and informal settings.

## Materials required for first class

- Square round green plastic dish (round dish with square base)
- Third of a block of oasis
- Five stems of spray carnations
- Ten short stemmed roses
- Four stems of leatherleaf fern or eucalyptus (or use any suitable foliage from the garden, e.g. conifer, hebe, box)

The finished design will be the size of a small dinner plate with a dome effect.
