Any skills or qualifications needed for entry into class?

All abilities but some basic knowledge/skills of floristry would be useful.

Course Description

We will be constructing a section of Contemporary designs. Contemporary means to be able to complete designs with a limited amount of materials. This will include some Christmas designs.

Teaching/learning methods used

This is a practical class. Teaching will be by demonstration and discussion.

Materials and equipment

Each week students need to bring their own flowers, foliage, scissors, tape, wire, a suitable oasis and container, and a notepad and pen.

Learner Outcome

Participants will develop their floristry skills, including using a wide range of accessories for use in a range of formal and informal settings

Materials required for first class

- Square based round plastic dish (available from tutor)
- Third of a block of oasis
- Three large chrysanthemum blooms
- Three medium sized fatsia leaves or six large ivy leaves
- Some small leaved foliage e.g. box, hebe
- Three stems of dogwood (cornus) or garden cane
- Four phormium or iris leaves

Materials required for second class

- Small designer dish or glass cube
- Third of a block of oasis
- Ten large ivy leaves
- Green asal
- Coloured aluminium wire
- Three large carnations or three roses
- Fifteen skeleton leaves
- Five pieces of bear or steel grass
