Topics covered	Assessments
<p>Throughout KS3 pupils will explore some of the big ethical, philosophical and religious issues in the world, before looking specifically at questions about war, peace, truth and the afterlife, it is important for pupils to have a grounding in what the major religions believe more generally.</p> <p>In Year 7 pupils begin with an introduction to the Study of Religion before exploring in more detail the Abrahamic faiths of Judaism, Christianity and Islam.</p> <p>In the second half of the year pupils will investigate the Eastern religions of Hinduism and Sikhism.</p>	<p>Pupils will complete assessments every half term including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What makes a religion presentation? - Summative assessment on Judaism - What does forgiveness mean to Christians? - Is Islam a scaring or caring religion? - What's all this about karma? Hinduism assessment - How many K's are there in Sikhism?
