These kinds of extreme sanctions are applied to serious one off events and/or cumulative behaviour instances. It is important that all parents/carers fully understand and support the College's response to significant breaches of our behavioural expectations that undermine the safety and learning of members of the College community.

This Friday's training day creates the time and space for teachers to benefit from external speakers and collaborative planning time to develop the curriculum for the new academic year. With a significant number of changes to programmes of study and assessment in recent years it is an important time for colleagues to develop professionally.

I look forward to seeing many of you welcoming our Year 11 leavers at their Ball on Friday evening. Thank you for your patience with the traffic caused by fancy vehicles arriving at Chilford Hall.
