For the academic year 2018-2019 Linton Village College received £8627 of catch-up funding.

Lexonik literacy training	£500	Lexonik promotes reading for knowledge, fluency of decoding and word mastery. Northumbria University analysis confirmed that from data collated, the average reading age gain of students is 27 months.

Staff literacy-lead time to coordinate and establish the Lexonik programme and whole-school literacy interventions	£2472	Intervention is targeted at the right students with progress being monitored throughout.
Development of IEPs and access arrangements for students requiring additional support in numeracy and literacy	£2000	Staff time spent assessing and writing IEPs for this target group will ensure all teaching staff are aware of the specific needs of the individuals and strategies to support them in the classroom.
